



# Extension Budget and Salary Savings Distribution



#### **Extension Budget Deficit**

State Extension Funding

Currently have a \$650,000 structural budget deficit associated with ongoing and the most recent UNL Budget Reduction.

#### **Mitigation Strategies:**

- Adjust salary savings distribution for EZs 1-11 and State 4-H Office.
- 2. Increase the number of positions funded directly by external partners.
- 3. Reduce the number of Extension positions.



#### **New Salary Savings Allocation**

#### Salary Savings - Example

- Salary savings are hard (UNL) state dollars
  - \$50,000 salary
  - 20% of salary funded by grant
  - Generates \$10,000 in salary savings (threshold is \$2,000)
  - Faculty member receives 30% of \$10,000 (\$3,000)
    - Available for faculty use in a "21" account
  - Dean's office retains 60% of \$10,000 (\$6,000)
    - Remains in Educator salary budget
  - Dean's office retains 10% of \$10,000 (\$1,000)
    - Available to program areas at the discretion of the Dean's office
- Minimum is \$2,000 of an individual's salary
- Spend within 12 months of accruing



#### **Salary Savings Uses**

Revenue generated when part of a faculty position is funded by a grant or other external funding (not program accounts or Smith-Lever federal funding).

- Backfill positions
- Professional development
- Travel
- Curriculum
- Equipment
- Program supplies
- Technology
- Generally, "like-for-like" program area support



# Nebraska Extension Disaster Education Network

#### Nebraska Extension Disaster Education Network Framework

#### **2025 – 3 Examples**

- March Winter Storm: \$65M in Losses, 27 Counties
- Wildland Fires: Over 55K Acres Statewide
- August Storm: \$24M in Losses, 23 Counties

#### **Nebraska Extension responded:**

- Delivered critical food safety guidance during power outages.
- Provided expert information/resources to address tree and landscape damage, and recovery.
- Equipped communities, farmers, and ranchers with support and tools for recovery.
- Promoted emergency safety measures to help protect lives, property, and livelihoods.
- and much more...



#### Tier 1 - Nebraska Readiness Network

#### Foundation for All Extension Personnel

- Prioritizes personal and workplace safety and readiness.
- Shares timely resources to help people make informed decisions before, during, and after an emergency or disaster event.
- Identifies local and regional risks and hazards.
- Communicates situational updates re: emergency/disaster events.
- Participates in emergency drills, and professional development that support readiness.



#### Tier 1 - Nebraska Readiness Network


#### Foundation for All Extension Personnel

#### Examples:

- Regularly reviews local Emergency Action Plans.
- Is familiar with office and vehicle emergency kits.
- Participates in and/or organizes office drills (tornado, fire, etc.).
- Shares information, resources in newsletters, websites, social media.
- Utilizes emergency and weather alert systems.
- Seeks out skills training (First Aid, CPR, Stop the Bleed, QPR).



#### Nebraska EDEN Framework



#### Tier 2 - Field Engagement Collective

Opportunities for Extension Faculty and Staff

- Integrates disaster education into programs and outreach.
- Reports local needs and impacts during emergencies.
- Serves as Extension local liaison with community partners and local emergency management.
- Engages in professional development to strengthen readiness.
- Identifies critical issues and fosters collaborative planning and resource sharing across Extension program areas.

Eligible to represent University of Nebraska as a National EDEN delegate.

#### Tier 3 - Operations

Membership by Invitation and/or Recommendation

- Leads and coordinates statewide all-hazards planning and response.
- Develops and delivers training, tools and resources to strengthen Extension's capacity.
- Activates as part of Nebraska Extension Incident Command (ICS) during major emergencies or disasters.
- Optimizes internal coordination and resource efficiency.
- Engages in focused emergency management and disaster education training.

Represents University of Nebraska as a National EDEN delegate.
